Through this newsletter we hope to keep you informed of the new developments taking place in the PGIM library and to encourage and develop a constructive dialogue between the library and its users with a view to fulfil your information needs more efficiently.

(INASP)

INASP has provided an invaluable opportunity for the libraries in Sri Lanka to access Full text articles on-line appearing in 8000 professional journals published abroad.

Four databases namely Synergy.com, Epnet.com, The Cochrane Library and the Blackwells Database are available free of charge for browsing under this project.

British Library Document Delivery Centre(BLDSC)

INASP has facilitated free access to INSIDE service maintained by the British Library. This service provides facilities to search the largest database of the world and identify relevant information resources from within books, journal articles, reports, theses etc.
