132 Theses, Dissertations and Case Reports submitted to PGIM by postgraduate trainees were


added to the Theses collection of the library during January to June 2007. An annotated Bibliography of this collection is available in the library for reference.

Senior Assistant Librarian – Mrs. Daisy Seneviratne was on sabbatical leave for one year and reported back for duties on 1<sup>st</sup> Nov. 2007. Mr. Sunil Premaratne, Assistant Librarian attached to the University of Peradeniya kindly agreed to do the cover-up duties during her absence.

During the leave period she was involved in establishing a library for the newly commenced Faculty of Medical and Allied Sciences at Rajarata University of Sri Lanka.

She had a study tour to University of Murdoch Library and the Medical and Dental Library of University of Western Australia by invitation. This exposure to modern library systems was very educational for developing customer centered resources and services once competent staff is available. She is thankful to PGIM for baring travel expense.

The library is run with the assistance of one labourer that is on her last extension of services and two daily paid assistants. It is an urgent need to get suitably qualified staff to run the library and improve the quality of services.

#### **Future activities:**

IELTS program is planed to start from 1<sup>st</sup> December 2007 at the Teaching Hospital auditorium with the patronage of the Alumni Association of the University of Peradeniya. The classes will be held on Saturdays 2.00pm to 5.00pm.

A user education seminar is to be organized in early 2008 with the collaboration of HELLIS network.
